# FZ-5 FUZZ

Owner's Manual







Thank you, and congratulations on your choice of the BOSS FZ-5 Fuzz.

Before using this unit, carefully read the sections entitled: "USING THE UNIT SAFELY" and "IMPORTANT NOTES" (supplied on a separate sheet). These sections provide important information concerning the proper operation of the unit.

Additionally, in order to feel assured that you have gained a good understanding of every feature provided by your new unit, this manual should be read in its entirety. The manual should be saved and kept on hand as a convenient reference.

A battery is supplied with the unit. The life of this battery may be limited, however, since its primary purpose is to enable testing.

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## **Main Features**


- The FZ-5 uses COSM technology to replicate three types of vintages fuzz boxes especially prized for their sound quality. These fuzz boxes incorporated germanium transistors in their circuitry, a key component to their sound. Germanium transistors are extremely rare today; the FZ-5 models these hard-to-find transistors at the component level to authentically reproduce the classic fuzz sounds of the 1960s and 1970s.
- The FZ-5's FUZZ knob features a BOOST range that allows you to achieve a deeper distortion than is possible with the original vintage models.

## About COSM (Composite Object Sound Modeling)

Composite Object Sound Modeling—or COSM for short—is Roland's innovative and powerful technology that's used to digitally recreate the sound of classic musical instruments and effects. COSM analyzes the many factors that make up the original sound—including its electrical and physical characteristics—and creates a digital model that accurately reproduces the original.

## **Panel Descriptions**



## 1. AC Adaptor Jack

This jack accepts the connection of an AC adaptor (optionally available BOSS PSA-series). By using an AC adaptor, you can play without being concerned about how much battery power you have left.

- \* Use only the specified AC adaptor (PSAseries), and make sure the line voltage at the installation matches the input voltage specified on the AC adaptor's body. Other AC adaptors may use a different polarity, or be designed for a different voltage, so their use could result in damage, malfunction, or electric shock.
- \* If the AC adaptor is connected while power is on, the power supply is drawn from the AC adaptor.
- \* If there is a battery in the unit while an AC adaptor is being used, the FZ-5 will switch over to battery-powered operation should the

line voltage be interrupted due to a power blackout or power cord disconnection.

## 2. CHECK Indicator

This indicator shows whether the effect is on or off, and also doubles as the battery check indicator. The indicator lights when the effect is on.

- \* If you're powering the unit with a battery and the CHECK indicator goes dim—or doesn't light at all—when you try to turn the effect on, the battery is near depletion and should be replaced. For instructions on changing the battery, refer to "Changing the Battery" (p. 13).
- \* The CHECK indicator shows whether the effect is being applied or not. It does not indicate whether the power to the device is on or not.

## 3. OUTPUT Jack

Connect this jack to the input of a guitar amp or another effects processor.

## 4. Pedal Switch

This switch turns the effect on/off.

## 5. Thumbscrew


When this screw is loosened, the pedal will open, allowing you to change the battery.

\* For instructions on changing the battery, refer to "Changing the Battery" (p. 13).

## 6. INPUT Jack

This jack accepts signals coming from a guitar or other musical instrument, or another effects unit.

\* The INPUT jack doubles as power switch. Power to the unit is turned on when you plug into the INPUT jack; the power is turned off when the cable is unplugged. When not using the effects unit, be sure to disconnect the plug from the INPUT jack.



### 7. LEVEL Knob

This knob controls the volume of the fuzz effect.

## 8. FUZZ Knob

This knob controls the amount of fuzz effect applied.

Tuning the knob clockwise intensifies the distortion.

Setting the knob at the center position produces the maximum distortion for the modeled fuzz box.

Turning the knob into the BOOST range creates distortion even greater than the original model can produce.

## 9. MODE Knob

This knob selects the fuzz box model.

#### MODE List

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F (FACE)	Models the Dallas-Arbiter FUZZ FACE. This unique round-shaped pedal was indispensable to the psychedelic fuzz sound of the late '60s. This modeled tone reproduces the fat sound of the Dallas-Arbiter units that used AC128 germanium transistors.
M (MST FUZZ)	Models the Maestro FZ-1A.  It faithfully reproduces the sound of models equipped with 2N2614 germanium transistors. A characteristic of this fuzz sound is a prominent boost in the high-frequency range.
O (OCTAVE FUZZ)	Models the Octavia fuzz. This model reproduces the original's characteristic of overlaying sound an octave higher as the sound decays. This distinctive sound can be obtained especially with single note in high pitch. Please try playing single note higher than 12th fret on 1st – 3rd string. Lowering the volume on the guitar or turning down the FUZZ knob makes it easier to obtain this effect.

## **Connections**

- \* Inserting a connecting plug into the INPUT jack turns on the power to the unit.
- \* Raise the amp volume only after turning on the power to all connected devices.
- \* The use of an AC adaptor is recommended as the unit's power consumption is relatively high. Should you prefer to use a battery, please use the alkaline type.
- \* To prevent malfunction and/or damage to speakers or other devices, always turn down the volume, and turn off the power on all devices before making any connections.
- \* If there is a battery in the unit while an AC adaptor is being used, the unit will switch to battery-powered operation should the line voltage be interrupted due to a power blackout or power cord disconnection.
- \* Some connection cables contain resistors. When connection cables with resistors are used, the sound level to be extremely low, or impossible to hear. For

- information on cable specifications, contact the manufacturer of the cable.
- \* Once the connections have been completed, turn on power to your various devices in the order specified. By turning on devices in the wrong order, you risk causing malfunction and/or damage to speakers and other devices.

#### When powering up:

Turn on the power to your guitar amp last.


#### When powering down:

Turn off the power to your guitar amp first.

- \* Always make sure to have the volume level turned down before switching on power. Even with the volume all the way down, you may still hear some sound when the power is switched on, but this is normal, and does not indicate a malfunction.
- \* When operating on battery power only, the CHECK indicator will become dim when battery power gets too low. Replace the battery as soon as possible.


#### A NOTE About Placement

BOSS Compact Pedals have a non-slip rubber pad attached to its bottom cover. Depending on the material and temperature of the surface on which you place the Compact Pedal, the rubber pad may discolor or mar the surface. You can place a piece of felt or cloth under the unit to prevent this from happening. If you do so, make sure the unit will not slip or move accidently during use.




\* This unit is equipped with a protection circuit. A brief interval (a few seconds) after power up is required before the unit will operate normally.


## **Operating the Unit**




**1.** After you have made the necessary connections (p. 8, 9), set the knobs as shown in the illustration.




- **2.** Depress the pedal switch to turn the effect on. (The CHECK indicator lights when the effect is on.)
- **3.** Select the fuzz box model with the MODE knob.





The original distortion range of the selected fuzz box model is reproduced when the FUZZ knob is set anywhere from fully counterclockwise to the center position. Turning the knob past the center position enables the BOOST range, which produces distortion that exceeds that available on the original model. The BOOST range provides plenty of distortion, even when using single-coil pickups.



**5.** Adjust the output volume with the LEVEL knob.


Normally, you should adjust the LEVEL knob so there's no difference in the volume when switching the effect on and off.

## **Using the Mode Sticker**

A mode sticker is included on the cover of this guide.

This sticker provides a reminder about the various fuzz box models that can be selected with the MODE knob. To make use of the sticker, peel it off the backing paper and affix it as shown in the figure.



## **Changing the Battery**

When the indicator goes dim or no longer lights while the effect is on, it means that the battery is nearly dead and must be replaced. Replace the battery following the steps below.

\* The use of an AC adaptor is recommended as the unit's power consumption is relatively high. Should you prefer to use a battery, please use the alkaline type.



- Loosen the thumbscrew at the front of the pedal, and then lift the pedal upwards to open the unit.
- \* The thumbscrew can be left in the pedal while changing the battery.
- 2. Remove the old battery from the battery housing, and remove the snap cord connected to it.
- **3.** Connect the snap cord to the new battery, and place the battery inside the battery housing.
  - \* Be sure to carefully observe the battery's polarity (+ versus -).
- 4. Slip the coil spring onto the spring base on the back of the pedal, and then close the pedal.
  - \* Carefully avoid getting the snap cord caught in the pedal, coil spring, and battery housing.
- **5.** Finally, insert the thumbscrew into the guide bush hole and fasten it securely.

## **Troubleshooting**

# The power won't come on / the CHECK indicator doesn't light

- Is the specified adaptor (PSA-series, sold separately) properly connected?
   Check the AC adaptor connection (p. 8, 9).
- \* Never use any AC adapter other than one specified for use with the FZ-5.
- Is the battery low or dead? Replace it with a new battery (p. 13).
  - \* The battery that was supplied with the unit is for temporary use, intended primarily for testing the pedal's operation.
  - \* The use of an AC adaptor is recommended as the unit's power consumption is relatively high. Should you prefer to use a battery, please use the alkaline type.
  - \* To prevent unnecessary battery consumption, be sure to disconnect the plug from the INPUT jack when not using the effects unit (p. 5).


- Is your guitar properly connected to the IN-PUT jack?
  - Check the connection once more (p. 8, 9).
- \* A cable must be connected to the INPUT jack to allow the effect to be turned on.
- \* If a cable is connected but no power is supplied to the unit (either from a battery or an AC adaptor), the CHECK indicator will not light when you try to turn the effect on.

#### No sound / low volume


- Is your instrument properly connected to the FZ-5?
  - Check the connection once more (p. 8, 9).
- Is the LEVEL knob set too low?
   The further counterclockwise you turn the LEVEL knob, the more the volume is reduced when the effect is on. Turn the LEVEL knob clockwise to increase the volume.
- Is the volume turned down on any guitar amp or effects device you have connected?
   Check the settings of the connected device.
